About Us

School of Law and Constitutional Studies (SLCS) is a constituent department of Shobhit Institute of Engineering & Technology, Meerut (A NAAC Accredited Deemed to-be University established u/s 3 of UGC Act) and is approved by Bar Council of India. SLCS intends to introduce students to the study of law with an emphasis on the Indian Constitution. The school focuses on legal studies with an understanding on how constitutional rules affect political and economic processes. Students also study the theory, history, economics, and development of constitutional thought. They also learn about natural and civil rights, a market economy, a self-governing citizenry, voluntary associations, and the rule of law.

Our Mission

School of Law and Constitutional Studies seeks to prepare students for the practice of law in India. We must attempt to instill in every student a respect for the rule of law, a devotion to the ideal of public service, and a commitment to basic professional values: honesty, diligence, competence, intelligence, and civility.

Our Pedagogy and Course-Curriculum

We're the first to admit it: Learning the law is not easy. You have to sharpen a range of skills, including analysis, writing, and persuasion. You also have to learn a canon of precedents, concepts, theories, and procedures. The law is rich with subtlety, and learning it is a skill in and of itself. Many feel bolstered by it. As a strong academic community, committed to our students, we have designed curricula that produce broadly educated lawyer with strong Constitutional background and we have developed an approach to teaching the law that is both challenging and supportive.

Enhancement of the upper level curriculum should build upon the School's strengths, which include well planned classes and a student-centered educational philosophy. We plan to develop "Capstone courses" for students in their third year, and "Externship" programs. The primary objective of "capstone courses" is to provide students with an enriched, practice-like experience that exposes them to the complexities of law practice in certain fields. These courses create many possible areas of collaboration between the law faculty and practicing advocates.

The "externship" would provide some upper-level students with instruction in a classroom setting, combined with closely-related work experience in a law firm, a non-profit organization, or a government agency. Administered by a faculty member, the externship program could focus on areas such as cyber law, immigration law, corporate law, or commercial law.

*Capstone Courses: These courses are generally designed for majors and minors in a given discipline and are offered almost exclusively to students in their final year. Capstone courses ask students to draw upon the knowledge they have obtained throughout their course work and combine it with relevant service work in the community. The goal of capstone courses is usually either exploring a new topic or synthesizing students understanding of their discipline. These courses offer an excellent way to help students transition from the world of theory to the world of practice by helping them make professional contacts and gather personal experience.

Interdisciplinary Approach

SLCS will take the necessary steps to create new programs with different schools of the university. New programs will enhance the law school's multi-disciplinary offerings as they promote the sort of wide-ranging curiosity that creates effective professionals.

Interdisciplinary centers strengthen the ability of scholars and teachers across the entire university to work on research together and to connect their work to issues of current social importance. One of our proposed possibility in future is a Center for the Study of Bioethics, Health, and Society, which would like focus on ethical issues related to stem cell technology, organ transplantation, and the holistic treatment of individuals with terminal illnesses.
